



## **CETSS Update: December 2017**

Dear parents/guardians

Please find below some updates and one Safety Alert.

- **Safety Alert**

A serious incident occurred outside the school yesterday. A student was struck by an unidentified adult on her way back to the school. The Gardaí have been informed and are investigating. Though an unusual incident, we would recommend that students leave the school in group for the time-being.

David has spoken to all students this morning.

- **Temporary Accommodation**

Last week, Educate Together informed our Board, that Planning Permission had just been submitted for a temporary school building in Nemo Rangers GAA Club. Delays of various kinds had prevented an application being submitted earlier. We now expect that the building (12 classrooms) will be delivered over the summer.

- **Parent-teacher Meetings**

The dates for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Year Parent-Teacher Meetings will be as follows:

A new booking system, which received positive feedback at the last Parents' Council meeting, will be trialled for these evenings. More information will follow shortly.

- **Reports today**

The first of three trimestral School Reports will be published on VSWare today. To access it, you must log into VSWare and follow 4 short steps. It takes about 1 minute, having logged in. Please see below for instructions.

- **Lord Mayor visit**

Today all First-Year students will attend a civic reception in the City Hall.

- **Educate Together Ethical Education Conference**

Second Year students attended ET's recent Ethical Education conference to present on the operation of our ground-breaking Student Assembly.

- **UCC Philosophy Department**

Second Year students demonstrated a P4C (Philosophy for Children) class for UCC Lecturers.

- **UCC Maths Circles**

UCC Maths students have been running Maths' Circles with our First-Year students for the past several weeks. These focus on problem-solving.

- **Grant from the Tomar Trust**

Substantial funding was received from the Tomar Trust to run four specific projects: 1. Restorative Practice training for teachers, parents and students alike; specialist Consensus-based decision-making training; an advanced technology project (see [preciousplastics.com](http://preciousplastics.com)) and a feasibility study for a Sustainability Centre for the permanent site.

Second Year students recently attend workshops creative-writing workshops in Graffiti Theatre recently. *Fighting Words* is an initiative founded by Roddy Doyle.

- **Raspberry Pis and Makey Makeys**

Our Raspberry Pis and Makey Makey kits have now arrived and so our Digital Literacy and Technology courses will move up a gear after the holidays.

- **Athletics**

Our runners did very well at the recent Cork School's Cross-Country Challenge and despite our small scale, they took established schools by surprise, having contended for medal positions.

- **IMMA**

Several Second-Year students had their art work displayed in the Irish Museum of Modern Art recently, as part of the Creative Engagement programme.

- **Student Nominees for the Board of Management**

Two students have recently been nominated by the student body to sit on the Board of Management.

- **Winter Variety Show**

Students will run a Winter Variety Show next week

- **Enrolment 2018**

Enrolment for 2018 is nearly complete. It looks like we will have an additional 90 students, which is our maximum intake.

- **Enrolment 2019**

First Round offers for 2019 will be sent out after the break.


## How to view student information (and print reports)

**Step 1:** Log in to <https://cetsl.vsware.ie> using the username and password that you received by text

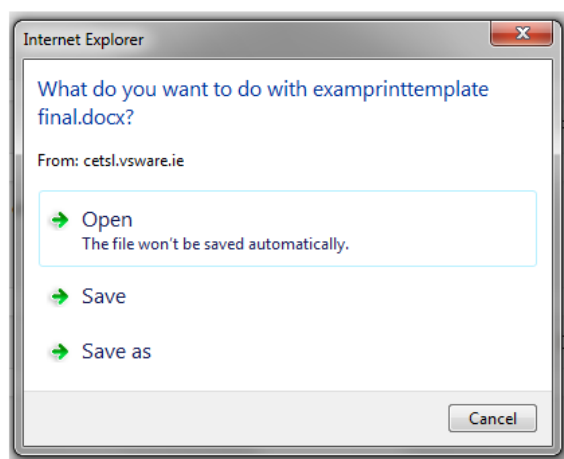
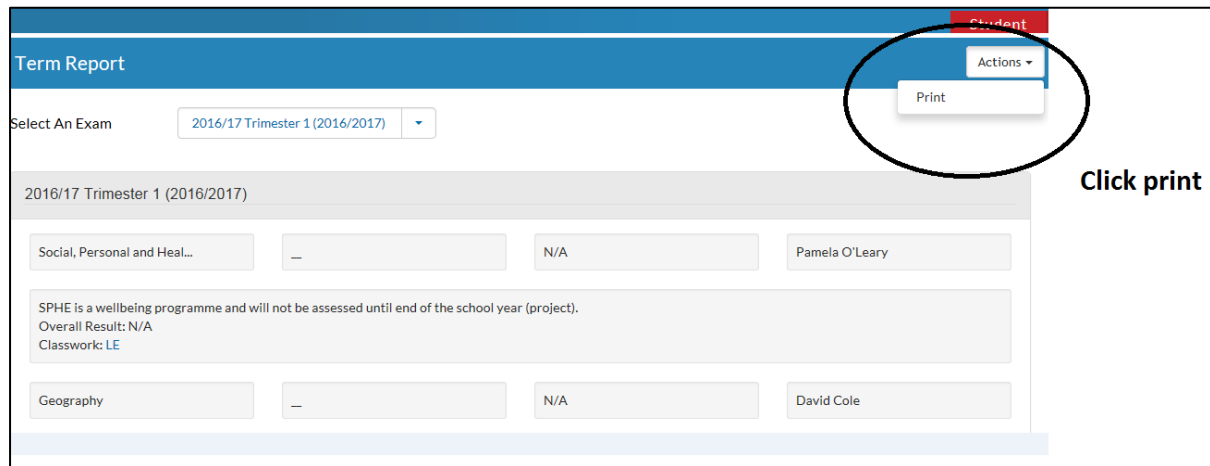

**Step 2:** If you want to see and print a report, click on 'Term Reports' and then select an exam (in this case you have only one option- 'Trimester 1 2017/18')

You will now see a list of subjects, such as the one below. This is a factual view of the data, but an ugly one. It's better to move directly to step 4.

**Step 4:** Click 'Actions' on the top right, then click 'Print' and finally 'Open' or 'Save As'.



This will open a printable report, in a familiar format (see below).

**N.B.** Each subject has five sub-headings; each of which is graded by codes. These codes are listed as descriptors on the second page. The codes are all being used as part of the new Junior Cycle and so, whilst a bit unusual at first, they will become normal for you quite soon.
